Primary Care Expansion

SPINA BIFIDA CLINIC: If you're a family with a child who has Spina Bifida, you likely need to see many different medical providers to care for your child. This often means making many different appointments in different offices, while coordinating complex schedules. At Children's Clinics, you show up for one appointment, on one day, in one building, and your entire care team comes to you. Additionally, your care team meets before and after your visit to make sure all of your care is coordinated and keeps your child as healthy as possible. New! Soccer and Swim

Our adaptive recreation program launched its first adaptive sports teams in 2018. With the support of University of Arizona's Mens Soccer and our therapists, we created opportunities for skill development and therapeutic play for our athletes. Additionally, swim coaches and therapists taught pool safety, basic swim



strokes, and fun. Adaptive sports offer our kids the ability to be part of a classic childhood experience they may otherwise have missed.



To date, our adaptive recreation program has helped 475 children ride in El Tour de Tucson, given away 300 adaptive tricycles, and had over 90 athletes participate in our adaptive soccer and swim programs.

VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT: TRAK

TRAK Ranch is a nonprofit organization that provides animal therapy for children in the southern Arizona community. Every month they set up a miniature ranch at Children's Clinics, providing our kids with the valuable opportunity to play with and care for all kinds of animals. They bring a wide array of

animals ranging from bunnies to miniature donkeys and fulfill their mission of brightening days and spreading joy.











My name is Kylie Brower. I am a woman, a sister, a daughter, a granddaughter, a friend, a mother, and I spend a lot of my time in a wheelchair, but I don't let that define me.

Kylie I have been going to Children's Clinics for the past 8 years. Children's Clinics offered me many great resources when I was first injured. I received physical therapy as well as care in the spinal cord injury clinic, which allowed me to see all of the specialists at the same time and not have to go to a bunch of different appointments. The doctors and staff at the clinic have become more like family. Everyone is always so kind when we are there. I have had various surgeries by Dr. Ashley (literally the best doctor in the world) with whom I met through the Children's Clinics, as well as additional spine surgeries with Dr. Neilsen.

Meet

Going to the clinic was very helpful for me because most of the doctors were aware of my various issues. I chose to have my daughter also receive her care at the clinic for many reasons. It was more convenient for me because we can have our primary care appointments together since we have the same primary care doctor. Additionally, I was already so familiar with the doctors and staff at the clinic; I knew that they would have my baby's best interest at heart.

Kylie's Story

It was just another normal day as a sixteen year old girl. I had left for school, finally excited that my mom didn't have to drive me anymore. It was the freedom I thought I couldn't get enough of, until I realized that freedom was more than I bargained for. My friends and I decided to go to grab a bite to eat during lunch. As usual the laughter and chatting had us lost and running out of time, before we knew we had to get back to school or we wouldn't hear the end of it from our parents. As normal as everything felt, I didn't realize what my new normal was about to be. Red

light, stop, green, go. Yet, what happens when it's out of your control? October 7th, 2011 my freedom turned into the most tragic day of my life... or was it?

I woke up in the hospital the next day, surrounded by family. With an understanding that my life was about to change in more ways than I could ever imagine. I wasn't able to walk, but I still had a heart; I was paralyzed from the waist down. Even though I knew my world had just been turned upside down,



I wasn't going to let this define me. I was more than just a girl in a wheelchair. I was told I was going to be in the hospital for at least 6 months, rehabilitating myself and adjusting to my new normal the best I could. Doubtful thoughts and hopeless dreams of never being able to walk again definitely crossed my mind, but I tried to not let that show or slow me down in my process to becoming the best version of myself. I was determined to define my new normal, not let it define me.

Most people would look at my situation as an "unfortunate circumstance" or a "terrible tragedy", but it is so much more than that. Something happened to me that day; I didn't lose my ability to walk, but gained the ability to see my life in a whole new way. I never gave up on myself and neither did my family. There are things in life that challenge us in ways that we deemed impossible, yet these challenges help mold and shape us into the individuals we are meant to be. I can honestly say that without this "tragedy" in my life I wouldn't be going to college and maintaining a 4.0 GPA. I wouldn't be a mother to the most beautiful baby girl in the world. Something that was said to be impossible was actually the easiest and most painless experience of my life since my accident. With all the complications, doubts and tears since that beautiful October day in 2011, becoming a mother was simply the easiest and most rewarding thing that's ever happened to me. I've found my new normal, my purpose, and I have my "beautiful tragedy" to thank.

Kaleidoscope of Care


From our humble beginnings in a playhouse in 1947, to the more permanent place we called home for 50 years, and now in our current home since 1991, our mission to help children has never wavered. Square & Compass Children's Clinic's 50,000 square foot facility on the campus at Tucson Medical Center houses 68 specialty and primary care providers in 28 pediatric disciplines, 22 rehabilitation staff, nine nurses, and five social workers, all dedicated to serving children with unique healthcare needs.

In 1991, when we partnered with Children's Clinics, the operational arm of all pediatric treatment was placed in their care. Children's Clinics is a one-stop medical facility that eases the burden of care on families with children with unique healthcare requirements. Patients receive all their care under one roof, from laboratory and radiology services to physical and occupational therapies.

In addition to providing a warm and welcoming facility, Square & Compass also provides funding for the healthcare costs of Children's Clinics' patients who are uninsured or underinsured for medical items and services they need. The cost of caring for a child with complex medical conditions can put a financial strain on families and we have made it part of our mission to help relieve some of those financial concerns so that families can put their attention back where it belongs, on the love and care of their child.

Square & Compass is proud of our partnership with the dedicated medical professionals at Children's Clinics. We remain very much involved in delivering comprehensive, multi-disciplinary medical care for children in Southern Arizona with complex medical conditions, and support Children's Clinics as they endeavor to deliver those services.

Although Square & Compass doesn't directly provide medical care, we're grateful to be able to support the Children's Clinics' pediatric specialists who do. Our vision, born out of necessity, remains the same as it was in 1947: to facilitate the care of children. Square & Compass remains dedicated to that ideal and legacy.
