This past year has reminded us how volatile and uncertain the healthcare landscape can be, both nationally and here in Arizona. Policy debates, shifting funding models, and the closure of longstanding programs highlight how fragile the system can be for families with medically complex children. Despite this turbulence, one truth remains steady: Children's Clinics continues to stand as an anchor for the families we serve. We remain deeply committed to our model of care, one that puts children and families at the center, and we continue to advocate for their needs at

As part of that commitment, this year we partnered with the University of Arizona to conduct a Quality Outcomes Study analyzing AHCCCS claims data from 2018–2025, that compared the care outcomes of medically complex children that received care at an MSIC vs those that did not. The results affirmed what we have long believed: the Multi-Specialty Interdisciplinary Clinic (MSIC) model works. Children cared for at an MSIC like ours are more medically complex. yet they live longer, have fewer hospital readmissions, and their care is more cost-effective compared to children receiving care elsewhere.

### HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE.

- MSIC patients live an average of 7.7 years longer
- Mortality is half that of non-MSIC patients
- 30-day readmissions are lower, even with greater medical complexity
- Costs remain comparable despite higher complexity, and for children in long-term care, costs are one-third of the alternative

These outcomes are not just data points; they represent lives extended, families supported, and futures made brighter. They reinforce why the MSIC model is not only vital, but essential to the future of healthcare for medically complex children in Arizona.

Our work continues to be guided by our three True Norths: Quality, Culture, and Sustainability:

- **Quality:** Excellence in care is at the heart of everything we do. Children's Clinics is proud to be fully accredited by The Joint Commission, healthcare's gold standard for safety and quality. This past year, we achieved our second consecutive perfect survey, a rare distinction that reflects our uncompromising commitment to the highest standards of care. It is a testament to the expertise of our providers, the dedication of our staff, and our relentless pursuit of delivering the very best to every child and family we serve.
- **Culture:** Our people are the foundation of our mission. We continue to invest deeply in the wellbeing of our staff, mental, physical, financial, and social, because when our team thrives, our families thrive. By fostering a culture of support, empowerment, and professional growth, we ensure that Children's Clinics remains a place where the most talented and compassionate providers choose to work, and where every family feels the strength of a united, caring community.







**Sustainability:** We are committed to being responsible stewards of our financial resources, ensuring that every dollar entrusted to us advances the mission of Children's Clinics. 



Finding Considence, Friendship, and Joy at Children's Clinics

Twelve-year-old Madeline's journey with Children's Clinics began when her pediatric orthopedic specialist, Dr. Valencia, retired from his surgical practice but continued providing care at the clinic. For Madeline and her mother, Sharron, the transition to Children's Clinics made sense, not only for continuity of care but because of the environment itself.

"It's (CCRS) a more welcoming environment. This lobby is much more different than other places. Everyone is so kind. They say hello when you're coming down the hall. That all helps to reduce the stress that a kid feels - that their family feels. It's like you almost look forward to coming," said Sharron.

What began as a medical transition soon opened the door to new opportunities. Beyond doctor visits and therapies, Madeline discovered Adaptive Recreation, Teen Group, and special events that quickly became highlights of her life. She also received an adaptive therapy bike through the clinic, and for the past two years she has proudly ridden in the El Tour de Tucson's Family Fun Ride.

"Her confidence has definitely improved since coming here, and her communication, the socialization. A lot of things she had never tried before, like basketball and soccer. All of these different activities she'd never tried before because there wasn't an avenue to it until we came here."

Sharron recalls that before coming to Children's Clinics, Madeline's days were filled with school, medical appointments, and therapy. Now, her world is enriched with theatre, music, adaptive **sports, Teen Group**, and most recently, a new opportunity through Team Impact, a nationwide program that pairs children with disabilities with college athletic teams.

"This opportunity with Team Impact has come about because of Children's Clinics," Sharron explained. "Avery (one of the buddy volunteers for Adaptive Recreation) came to us during tennis practice and mentioned that she was recruiting for Team Impact and Madeline came to mind."

Prompted to apply, Sharron asked if Team Impact had ever matched a child with a marching band. They had only done it once before, with Northwest University. Soon after,

Madeline made history as the second child nationwide to be paired with a marching band. On August 5, 2025, she signed with the University of Arizona's Pride of **Arizona marching band**, becoming an honorary member for the next two years.

For Sharron, the impact of Children's Clinics has been just as life changing as it has been for Madeline.

"Through adaptive sports, there are all these connection points to other Children's Clinic families. You have that whole relational piece that's just, it's very, very special. These are my friends. I have built the most beautiful relationship with them, and we all care about each other. We care about each other's kids, and we love each other's kids. We celebrate accomplishments with other families."

Reflecting on their journey, Sharron added:

"I always say, Madeline is a blessing. She is a huge blessing to our family. If it wasn't for her condition, I wouldn't know so many beautiful people in this world, the families, the other kids, the therapists that work with her, the doctors, you know, we wouldn't know all of these people. It's hard not to be emotional about it. It's a beautiful community that's come together."

# The Multi-Specialty Interdisciplinary Clinic (MSIC) Model

# TRANSFORMING CARE FOR CHILDREN WITH COMPLEX MEDICAL NEEDS

Some children face more than their fair share of challenges. Children with medical complexity live with multiple chronic conditions, often relying on medical technology and round-the-clock care. They make up only six percent of Arizona's Medicaid-insured children, vet they account for nearly forty percent of all pediatric Medicaid costs. Without specialized models of care, these children and their families face fragmented systems, repeated hospitalizations, and overwhelming emotional and financial strain that impact the entire healthcare system.

At **Children's Clinics**, we believe every child deserves the chance to live as fully as possible. That's why we believe so strongly in the Multi-Specialty Interdisciplinary Clinic (MSIC) model. This unique approach brings together pediatric subspecialists, primary care providers, behavioral health clinicians, social workers, therapists, and dedicated care coordinators, all under one roof. For families, that means fewer appointments across multiple locations, less time navigating complex systems, and a trusted team that knows their child. The Arizona MSIC model is one of only a handful of its kind nationwide, and it is being recognized as a leading example of how to deliver complex pediatric care with compassion, coordination, and measurable results.


The results are life changing. A recent University of Arizona analysis of Arizona Medicaid claims data (2018–2025) showed that children receiving care at MSICs had far

more complex health conditions than their peers, yet experienced far better outcomes:

- 50% lower mortality rate for children in MSIC care.
- An average of eight more years of life, 18.2 years versus 10.5 years for non-MSIC peers.
- Fewer hospital readmissions, reflecting stronger day-to-day health management.
- Comparable or lower overall costs, despite higher medical needs.
- Over 60% lower long-term care costs, saving resources while improving quality of life.

Behind these numbers are real children and families who experience greater stability, more joyful moments together, and hope for the future. Parents tell us that the MSIC model doesn't just improve medical care; it gives them back precious time with their children and the peace of mind that comes from knowing they are not navigating this journey alone.

Thanks to donors and community partners, Children's Clinics continues to lead the way in providing compassionate, cost-effective, and family-centered care for Arizona's most medically fragile children. With your support, we can preserve this proven model, expand its reach, and ensure that no child with complex medical needs is left behind. # Children's Clinics' Down Syndrome Regression Clinic: RESTORING LIVES AND INDEPENDENCE

At Children's Clinics, we are proud to provide cutting-edge care through our Down Syndrome Regression Clinic, a program that addresses a complex and often unrecognized condition affecting individuals with Down syndrome.

Down Syndrome Regression, sometimes referred to as Down Syndrome Disintegrative Disorder, is a condition in which children or young adults with Down syndrome experience a sudden loss of skills they previously mastered. These can include communication, self-care, mobility, and social interaction. The onset is often confusing and distressing for families, as individuals who were independent or semi-independent may suddenly struggle with basic daily activities.

Dr. David Crawford, who co-leads the clinic, explains, "This condition has existed for a long time, but it was largely unrecognized until the past decade. Consensus guidelines for diagnosis have only been published in the last two to three years. Awareness is growing, and our clinic was established to meet a clear need: to evaluate, diagnose, and treat patients with this complex condition."

The clinic requires a multidisciplinary approach. In addition to pediatric expertise, patients often need evaluation by immunologists and neurologists, as treatments may include interventions such as intravenous immunoglobulin (IVIG). Our team works closely to coordinate extensive testing, including MRIs, lumbar punctures, and lab work, followed by careful review, diagnosis, and insurance advocacy to secure access to treatment.

"The process can be challenging," Dr. Crawford notes. "It's not one-sizefits-all. Each patient responds differently to treatments, so we often try multiple approaches to find what works. But when it works, it's transformative."

Families of patients often describe the impact as life-altering. Many of the individuals affected were fully participating in school, work, and social life before regression. After treatment, some regain their ability to speak, eat, and interact with their communities, effectively reclaiming their independence.

Since opening nearly two years ago, the clinic has seen approximately 10 patients. While the condition is rare, the clinic has already made a significant difference in the lives of those we serve. "Before, families were told, 'This is just what happens.' Now, we can offer hope, treatment, and, most importantly, the chance to regain lost abilities," says Dr. Crawford.

Children's Clinics' Down Syndrome Regression Clinic is the only program of its kind in Arizona and one of fewer than 10 centers nationwide actively diagnosing and treating this condition. It stands as a testament to our commitment to innovative, family-centered care and to restoring the health, independence, and quality of life for children and young adults with Down syndrome.





This July, **Children's Clinics** hosted its most vibrant Back-to-School Fair to date, made possible through the generous support of **Mercy Care** and an incredible network of community partners. More than just a school supply distribution, the event transformed into a celebration of confidence, care and community spirit – complete with free haircuts, glitter tattoos and countless beaming smiles.

The Back-to-School Fair was held at our campus, and distributed over 600 backpacks, including specialized adaptive backpacks, to patients and their siblings. Each backpack was thoughtfully packed with grade-appropriate essentials, from basic supplies like folders and crayons to practical items such as water bottles and earbuds, ensuring every child could start the school year feeling prepared and proud.

For families raising children with complex medical needs, back-to-school season often brings additional financial and emotional strain. **Mercy Care's** ongoing partnership helps make this event a muchanticipated source of both practical support and joy. Their team members joined the festivities, personally distributing backpacks while sharing resources and words of encouragement.

A standout feature of the day was the free haircut stations staffed by **Supercuts** stylists, who volunteered their time to give students fresh back-to-school looks. They supplemented their services with free haircut coupons, extending the positive impact beyond the event itself.

The fair buzzed with meaningful activities and connections. Children lined up for glitter tattoos, participated in an interactive "high-five" goal-setting exercise, and selected uplifting affirmation cards to carry with them throughout the school year. Medical staff were also available to assist families in scheduling well-child visits, emphasizing the vital connection between physical health and academic success.

The event's success was further amplified by contributions from **Walmart**, **QuikTrip** and **Truly Nolen**. More than 50 dedicated volunteers from **Mercy Care**, **Hughes Federal Credit Union**, **Maxim Healthcare Staffing**, **MGA Homecare** and the **UA Pals Lab** kept activities running smoothly while distributing supplies and spreading cheer. **Eegee's** provided refreshing frozen treats, offering a sweet conclusion to the day's festivities.

# A Stormy Night, a Big Win: CHILDREN'S CLINICS RECEIVES OVER \$66,000 FROM 100+ WOMEN WHO CARE TUCSON

On a stormy July evening in 2024 at the La Paloma Resort, Children's Clinics had a moment to shine. Our Development and Communications Specialist, Amy Serafin, took the stage at the **100+ Women Who Care Tucson** "Big Give" event to share our story. Out of dozens of nonprofits, three organizations were drawn from the hat to present, and Amy had the opportunity to speak about the children and families we serve. After the votes were cast, Children's Clinics was announced as the top vote-getter, receiving \$61,480 that evening, plus a \$5,000 matching gift from The Richard M. Schulze Family **Foundation**—bringing the total to more than \$66,000.

Founded in 2015, 100+ Women Who Care Tucson is a group of community-minded women who pool their resources to make a greater impact together. Each quarter, members nominate local nonprofits, hear presentations, and then vote to award funding. Once a year, they partner with 100+ Guys Who Give Tucson for the "Big Give," combining forces for an evening of generosity that transforms the community.

The impact of that stormy night has been profound. With the funding, Children's Clinics invested in medical interpretation training and certification, expanding from just one certified Spanish medical interpreter to eleven, ensuring families feel fully understood in their care. The gift also allowed us to host our first bereavement and memorial event





for families and staff grieving the loss of patients, create a support group for siblings of children with special needs, and provide adaptive therapy bikes and trikes to patients. In addition, a portion of the funding supported our Family Assistance Fund, helping families with rent, utilities, food, gas, diapers, medical devices, and other essential needs. The impact has been tremendous!

What began as a stormy evening turned into a bright moment for Children's Clinics. We are profoundly grateful to 100+ Women Who Care Tucson, 100+ Guys Who Give Tucson, and The Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation. Their support continues to ripple through our community, touching the lives of children and families in lasting, meaningful ways.

# Growing Connections: TEEN & YOUNG ADULT GROUP

At Children's Clinics, we know that teens and young adults with complex medical needs benefit not only from excellent healthcare but also from opportunities to connect, grow, and simply be themselves. # Save Our Fish: A COMMUNITY EFFORT THAT MADE A SPLASH

# For years, our saltwater fish tank has been a beloved part of the Children's Clinics lobby.

For years, our saltwater fish tank has been a beloved part of the Children's Clinics lobby. Whether it's Bubba gliding past the glass or bright tropical fish darting between coral, the tank has offered a calming, cheerful welcome to patients, siblings, and families during their visits.

But behind the glass, time was taking its toll. The original tank's base was made of pressed board, a material that doesn't mix well with water. After years of wear, it became clear that Bubba and his aquatic friends needed a safer, sturdier home.

That's when the **Save Our Fish – S.O.F.** campaign began. Our goal: raise \$22,000 to replace the tank with a new, high-quality 96-inch saltwater aquarium that could last for years to come.

The response from our community was overwhelming. Donations came in all sizes, from the pennies and quarters dropped into our lobby donation bucket to a generous \$10,000 gift from the **Margaret T. Morris Foundation**. Every single contribution, no matter the size, helped bring us closer to our goal.

Just before Thanksgiving 2024, the new tank was installed by **Fishy Bizness**, who generously donated their time, and Bubba and friends moved into their spacious new home. There have even been a few exciting new additions to the family, including an eel who's quickly become a staff and patient favorite.

Thanks to the generosity of so many, the fish will continue to greet and delight everyone who walks through our doors, turning anxious moments into calm ones, and bringing a bit of underwater magic to the heart of our clinic for many years to come.





This year, thanks to generous funding from Pilot Parents, Children's Clinics created a new position designed to strengthen the bridge between families, providers, and the services they need most: the Community Health Liaison. We are proud to welcome **Corey Gilchrist** as the first to serve in this important role.

As Community Health Liaison, Corey serves two essential functions. First, he meets families in the community who may benefit from Children's Clinics and introduces them to the many services available under one roof. He also connects with community providers, such as pediatricians and OB/GYNs, ensuring they know about the resources available to support their patients. Second, for families already established at the Clinic, Corey acts as a navigator, helping them maximize care, especially for those within the Children's Rehabilitative Services (CRS) designation.

"Our mission is to serve as a medical home for children with complex medical needs,"

Corey explains. "That doesn't just mean having all the providers families need in one place. It also means helping families feel like they are part of something bigger, that they belong here."

The role is as much about connection as it is about coordination. Success, Corey notes, will mean that Tucson providers know about all the services offered at Children's Clinics, families feel fully supported in their child's care, and specialty clinics remain full and thriving.

Corey brings warmth and enthusiasm to his work, along with a deep appreciation for the Clinic community. "I love talking to people about the Clinic because it's such a great place," he says. "I've been privileged to sit in on specialty clinics and watch our providers interact with patients, and it's amazing. Everyone here is truly the best in their field."

With Corey's guidance, families are better supported, providers are more connected, and the sense of belonging at Children's Clinics continues to grow.
